Family Faith Reflection:

Psalm 27:14 - “Wait for the Lord; be strong and take heart and wait for the Lord.”

During Advent, we prepare our hearts for Christmas – a special time of *waiting*. In the Bible, Psalm 27:14 tells us “Wait for the Lord; be strong and take heart and wait for the Lord.” That means we can be brave and hopeful while we wait, because God is always working, even when we can’t see it yet.

Think about a time you were really excited for something – maybe the birth of a baby, a trip, or a special event like graduation or first communion. Waiting can be hard! We might think, “*Why can’t it just happen already?*” But Advent reminds us that **waiting can help us grow**.

While we wait patiently:

- **We learn to trust God.** Just like we trust that Christmas will come, we can trust that God brings good things in the right time.
- **We practice strength and courage.** That’s what the verse tells us – being patient makes our hearts stronger.
- **We notice more blessings.** When we slow down, we see the small joys around us: kindness from friends, holiday decorations, acts of love we can do for others.

God’s people waited a very long time for Jesus to come. They didn’t know exactly when He would arrive, but they believed in God’s promise. Their waiting wasn’t empty – it was full of hope.




Bellarmine Speech Team
