

Middle School has been busy this month! Here are a few highlights and updates from some of the classes:

Here's what's happening in the Art Room:

- Our eighth grade students just completed a unit on tessellations. Look for them in the second floor gallery. They have now started the painted shoe project. This year they will be designing their shoe around one person who inspires them.
- After wrapping up two Op Art projects, our seventh graders are learning about one-point and two-point perspectives. After a few weeks of practice, we will be creating a final project involving drawing words in perspective.
- Sixth grade started the quarter with a couple of projects using "lines," and are now venturing into some relief sculpture work. The students are creating faces out of egg cartons.
- As far as our art electives, eighth grade students in Open Studio are making garden dragon flies out of old ceiling fan blades and the Art of Star Wars is diving into Episode 4, A New Hope, and learning about the art that went into creating the film.
- Seventh grade students in the Children's Books elective are in the middle of creating original stories (with prompts supplied by some professional writers) and sixth grade students have started the process of building paper bowls.
- Both the sixth and seventh grade Ceramics students have built and started painting a series of bowls, mushrooms, and snail or octopus cups.

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Here's what's happening in Religion

-The middle school prayed the Stations of the Cross today in this first week of Lent. It was a beautiful prayer service led by our 8th Graders who did a fantastic job!! Thank you to Barb Roddy for playing the beautiful music during the stations, and to the parents/grandparents that were able to join us today. Parents are invited to join us in church at the middle school campus for Stations of the Cross every Friday in Lent at 11 a.m.

-In the classroom, students have been learning about Lent and focusing on the three pillars of prayer, fasting/penance, and almsgiving. Each student was given a Catholic Relief Services "Rice Bowl" box and lenten calendar if they would like to participate in that almsgiving activity as a family. This is an optional activity, and many have found it to be a fruitful way to engage in this Lenten season with the calendar listing daily giving challenges, the "Did You Know" facts, and the various stories about people the organization has helped.

If you do choose to participate, families can donate directly to the organization at the end of Lent (more details and website information is on the box). Have a Happy Lent!



Are you interested in volunteering but haven't found your "fit"? We are kicking off a new HCPA program and would love your help!


HCPA would like to create an Angel Family program to welcome new families to HCA, by pairing up a new family with an existing family to mentor them.


