Uniforms at the Middle School

We have noticed a trend of untucked shirts, missing belts, rolled skirts and short shorts. When in regular HCA uniform, shirts should be tucked in. If a student is wearing shorts with belt loops a belt should be worn. Skirts should be an "appropriate length". An "appropriate length" varies from student to student. However, a good rule of thumb is no more than 4" above the knee or if the student is standing with their arms at their sides, their fingertips should not be past the hemline. For shorts, students should adhere to the same rule that is utilized for PE shorts (4 inch or longer inseam).

On non-uniform days, students are expected to dress and present an appearance consistent with standards of good taste and appropriate for school and school events.

Parents, we ask for your cooperation in ensuring that your child adheres to the school's dress code. We understand that trends evolve, but it is possible to "look cool" and still follow the guidelines put in place by HCA.
